**1. Rules** - This regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2009-2012 including the prescriptions of US Sailing and the Wianno Senior Class Rules, except as modified by this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.

**2. Eligibility** - This regatta is open to all Wianno Seniors

**3. Registration** – On-line registration is required.

**5. Sailing Instructions** - The Sailing Instructions for the Regatta will be available at the Wianno Senior Class Association website and at the Bass River Yacht Club.

**6. Courses** - Courses and Racing Areas will be delineated in the Sailing Instructions

**7. Class Rules** - The Wianno Senior Class rules stipulate a 360 degree turn for breaking a rule of Part 2. This changes Rules 44.1 and 44.2.

**8. Lunch** - Lunch will be provided each day at the Yacht Club starting at 11:30. There will be a cocktail party after the race on Saturday at the Yacht Club.

**9. Launch** - Launch service will be available starting at 9:00 A.M. Saturday morning. If you plan to arrive on Friday, and will require a launch, advise us of your ETA by calling the Club at 508-398-9701 or Ralph Lincoln at 508-394 4206. There will also be launches available on Sunday afternoon after the Hyannis Wianno Senior Regatta should you wish to arrive early. Please let us know.

**10. Docks and Moorings** - We anticipate having a dock or mooring available for all participants. There will be launches about on Saturday morning and afternoon to direct you as necessary. Ralph Lincoln (508 394-4206) is coordinating this effort. If you wish to anchor, anchoring is available in any open area, and the holding ground is generally good. Avoid the areas around Stage Island. It is shallow at low tide and the currents tend to be stronger there. Keep in mind that this is a tidal river. Use chain and plenty of scope, but stay away from moorings, which tend to have shorter lines.

**11. Yacht Club Floats** - Do not plan on tying up on the face of the yacht club dock, it is for touch and go's only. The face is reserved for club boats.
